Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - March 12, 2019

Hello All:

Last Weekend: Our scheduled ride for Sunday was the century of the month -- "Circling San Fernando." The weather forecast was more promising for Saturday so I decided to ride the century on Saturday. I optimistically thought that if the weather was OK on Sunday maybe I would go out and do the metric on that day. But because of the time change, it was still dark when I woke up to get ready for the ride and I was tired from Saturday's ride, so I convinced myself that it would probably rain anyway and I didn't go. As it turned out, it didn't rain and I should have gone. Oh Well. David Nakai did go and sent a report out to the Yahoo Group. It turns out there was only one other rider -- Sheila Szymanski. Sheila was doing the metric while David was doing the full century. Actually David was using our century as the 2nd half of a 200 mile ride. He had ridden the first 100 miles during the night. There were no major climbs, but there was still a lot of climbing scattered throughout the course and it totaled up more than 6000 feet of gain. Then the sun would break through and I would suddenly be enjoying the day and thinking what a nice ride I was having.
