## Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - December 3, 2019

Hello All:

**Last Week:** Last Thursday was Thanksgiving and we had scheduled our usual Thanksgiving Day ride. Unfortunately, it was raining in the morning and rained on and off during the day, so as far as I know, no one attended the ride. I think this is the first time in many years that this ride has been rained out. We had better luck on Sunday when the scheduled ride was "Santa Anita Canyon." Although it was overcast most of the day, there was no rain in the forecast. We had 8 riders show up and I took this photo at the start:

Jacques and I did the long. I believe most of the others did a modified medium which took them up to Chantry, but then they tacked on at least a portion of the long route to increase their miles. **Rafal** sent me some photos. This first is of Mel and Dale climbing up to Chantry.



This second photo was taken out towards Claremont and shows how low the snow on the mountains was. These are the lower mountains in front of Baldy. Baldy wasn't visible because of some low clouds.



I was struck by all the snow on the mountains too. I took this photo of Mount Wilson from down in Pasadena. It was only a little over a month ago that we rode up there, but I was thinking I was glad I wasn't riding up there this week.



**Next Sunday:** This Sunday we will be riding our (now) traditional December century and metric century: the "Foothill Footsie." The full century starts at Crescenta Park in Glendale and rides out to Upland and back. The metric century does the center portion of the full century (the better portion) by starting and hour later in Pasadena and riding to Upland and back. I always enjoy this century. The holiday season is in the air. Homes are being decorated and the tree lots are in full swing. Right now, the weather forecast is a bit up in the air. The air is so clear and fresh. I was in Palos Verdes and was looking out over the Santa Monica Bay. This is a sight I've seen hundreds of times, but it stuck me how pretty it was after the rain. It was so clear you could see detail of buildings all the way to Malibu. **Mel Cutler** also rode on Friday and he sent me this photo (I think taken in the Palasades area):
