On Saturday, November 21, I participated in Death Valley Century.

We started the ride as the sun was coming up over mountains. Large portions of the valley were still in deep shadow. The first part of the ride is the half century, it was from Furnace Creek to Badwater and back. As you can see from the picture below, the only option was "FINISH" but this is our starting point.

The rewards are stunning vistas and descent spectacular descent down Beatty Road. The rest stop just before climb had soda, I guzzled it down in anticipation of the climb. There was another rest stop at the top. Once we were done descending the road back to Furnace Creek was uneventful the excitement of challenging climb and speedy descent used up my adrenaline so I just kept paceline to the finish line.
