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Hello All:

Sunday: The predictions for rain were pretty serious last Sunday and I decided not to go. I don't know that anyone did ride. I like those routes, so I will probably re-schedule them sometime in April or May. Otherwise they probably wouldn't be scheduled for another one and half years. The club has enough routes that if we just ran them in a regular rotation, they would come up about every 18 months.

Next Week: This Sunday we will be riding our Century and Metric Century of the month -- "Beaches to Brea Canyon." These routes start from Manhattan Beach and first head south down to Long Beach and then inland with the full century making it all the way to Brea Canyon. The metric stays with the full century at first, but turns back before reaching Brea. The routes spend a fair amount of time (maybe 20% of the century) on bike paths and the century also rides a number of streets with few stop signs such as Brea Canyon, Pathfinder, and East Road/West Road. The result is that these routes are relatively fast despite being mainly urban routes. The full century has some climbing, but the metric cuts most of that off. I hope to be there. Note that the start time is 7:30 a.m,.
