
Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - August 4, 2020

Hello All:

Sunday: Last Sunday we started at the "Corner" to ride "Exploring the Environs." I believe there were 11 riders. I didn't get a photo at the start. Three of us (Bill Faulkner, Mel Cutler and me) did he short route which included a trip up Franklin Canyon. It was my first significant climb since returning to riding and I was apprehensive, but I did make it. (I have a triumphant thumbs up photo of myself that Mel took at the top, but I don't care for the way I look in it and the nice thing about being the author of this weekly e-mail is that I can decline to include unflattering photos of myself.) Only the long actually hits the third county but they both do some climbing after lunch. I plan to be there and again I plan to ride the short route. I do feel like I'm returning to form and maybe I will graduate to the medium route in a couple of weeks. But for now, it is still the short for me.

Many may remember that back in the 80s or early 90s Bob used to lead a ride every Sunday from Griffith Park to Santa Monica and back. When I wasn't doing the regular Sunday ride I sometimes joined them and it was quite a group. I remember he also
