Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - August 18, 2020


Hello All:

Sunday: On Sunday we were riding our monthly century and metric century. There were six riders at the start and Gary Murphy took this photo:



That's Nancy Domjanovich, Phil Whitworth, Rafal Karpinski, Andy Pollack and David Williams. Although Phil was at the start, he apparently did his own ride elsewhere. Nancy was not feeling well and, as luck would have it, the route went nearly past her home, so she just called it a day at that point. That left 4 doing the century. Meanwhile, both Jacques Stern and I intercepted the route from our respective homes and joined the others until the metric and full century split. We completed most of the metric route, but because we had not begun from the starting point, we both ended up with only about 50 miles. As you know, it was very hot. Gary reported that the heat began to take its toll on the century riders and they cut the route a bit short in Palos Verdes. I'm not sure if that meant they did not complete an official century. It would be a shame if they didn't because it was to be Andy's first century. But if he didn't make it, not to worry -- we do this every month.

All sanctioned randonneuring events had been suspended during the pandemic, but "Permanents" have recently been allowed again since they are typically ridden alone and don't involve any manned controls. This was a 200K course which took them from West Hollywood up to Port Hueneme and back. The mostly coastal route should have been good for such a hot weekend.
