We split between the long and medium but there were lots of variations along the way, so it's hard to say exactly what any particular rider did. 

Looks like they had a good time. Strong winds picked up later in the day. It must have been a tailwind some of the time because I noticed on the "Relive" track that Phil provided me of his ride, it put a marker at the point where he achieved his maximum speed and it was 50 mph coming down Sepulveda. I've never come close to 50 mph on Sepulveda. **Kit Gray** sent me an edited version of his ride on the medium route using his 360 degree camera. Other Ride: David Nakai was apparently doing a "permanent" along the coast on Sunday. He sent this photo of the beach at Santa Monica after the wind. You can see how smooth the sand was and that the trash cans had been blown over.



Next Week: Next Sunday we will be riding our monthly century and metric century: the "Camarillo Century." We start in Brentwood and both routes head to the coast and then ride up and over Topanga/Old Topanga to the Valley. They then head west to Agoura where the two routes split. The full century continues to Camarillo for lunch and then to the coast for a return back down PCH. The metric has lunch in Agoura and then cuts to the coast on Mulholland Hwy and Kanan Dume where it then rejoins the full century for the return on PCH. Although about 30 miles shorter, the metric has the climb up the "Rock Store" hill which gives it about the same amount of total elevation gain as the full century (about 5000 feet). I had hoped to do the full century, but my poor performance last Sunday convinced me to do the metric. With that 5000 feet of climbing, it will be tough enough.
