He had done 11 more miles than us including some additional steep climbing but still caught us. Most of the way up San Francisquito we were riding into an increasingly strong headwind. Just about the only thing that kept me going was the thought that once we reached the top and started back down Bouquet Canyon we would have a great tailwind. Well, we sure did. Going down Bouquet is about 16 miles of almost unbroken downhill. Usually on the last several miles the gradient is so slight, you have to pedal to keep your speed up, but not so much on Sunday. It was the best time I've ever had riding down that Canyon. It was Whee, Whee, Whee all the way. What a nice way to finish the day. Gary took this photo on the way up.



It shows that there were some fall colors even in San Francisquito. There was probably even better fall colors in Bouquet which has more trees, but I was whizzing down so fast, I really didn't notice. Parting Shot: Nothing funny or odd tonight, but I thought this was interesting. Every time we climb San Francisquito, we go under this big water pipe near the top of the canyon (photo on the left) and I had always assumed that this was the same pipe we pass over near the bottom of Bouquet Canyon road (photo on right)



But, just to make sure, I traced the pipe using satellite view from the top of San Francisquito and it's not the same pipe. The pipe we go under dumps into the Bouquet Reservoir. I couldn't tell where the 2nd pipe came from because a short distance from where I took the photo, it goes underground and I couldn't trace it. I suspect it comes from Lake Casatic because it is headed in that direction. Well, at least I thought this was interesting.
