
## Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - January 17, 2023



However, when he realized it wasn't going to rain, he did his own ride along the San Gabriel River. At one point he was going to go up San Gabriel Canyon, but was stopped by the police who told him there as a landslide ahead. He sent this photo:



I heard about this road closure on the news that night -- somewhere near the Morris Dam I believe. Mario also sent this photo from the top of the Whittier Narrows Dam looking up stream.



That's the bike path on the left. I don't recall ever seeing that much water in this portion of the river.

This Weekend: This weekend is our annual "Janus Sequential Centuries." We have been doing this for well over 20 years. The original idea was to ride back to back centuries on Saturday and Sunday with Sunday's route simply being the reverse of Saturday's route. There was a time when riders (including me) rode both days, but I don't think anyone has done that in a while. Over the years ridership for even one day has fallen off. I've considered abandoning it entirely, but it's a nice century route. Maybe next year we will only offer one day. The route is essentially the center portion of the old Grand Tour Highland route (without Casitas Pass) making a large loop around Ventura County. We ride counterclockwise on Saturday and clockwise on Sunday. With all the rain, I haven't done enough riding to tackle a century at this point, but the Sunday metric century isn't too bad, so I plan on riding that. I would welcome some company.

Holiday Party and Meeting: Just a reminder that the Holiday Party is this Thursday. **2022 Riding Stats:** I heard from **Dale Aaronson** who rode 9333 miles in 2022 with a very impressive 619,478 feet of climbing. That's well over a vertical century (100 miles of climbing or 528,000 feet). The International Space Station orbits at about 1,300,000 feet so Dale climbed almost half way to the station.
