Grand Tour History: Individual Stats (1959-2007)

We have compiled a database of all riders completing the Grand Tour in its first 49 years. This data is drawn from the finisher lists published in the Gooseneck over those years and is probably subject to many errors. However, these are correct to the best of our knowledge. With that caveat, we present the top finishers in a number of categories.

Most Grand Tours Completed (This includes all distances including the century) The current leader is **Ralph Boethling** at 30 with **Clem Bartolai** and **Dennis Miller** in hot pursuit at 26. Both Clem and Dennis are still riding the Tour, so they may take the lead in a few years. All those with more than 10 are listed below.

Weighted Completion Score. The above list counts all Grand Tours equally, and doesn't reflect those who rode a lot of triples and quads, but not necessarily a lot of Grand Tours. So we came up with the "Weighted Completion Score" which gives one point for each century completed, 2 for each double, 3 or triples and 4 for quads. Those with a WCS over 33 are shown below. A lot of the same names are there, but it shakes up the order somewhat.

Longest Gap Between Completions. Most riders who ride more than once tend to cluster their years together. Once you skip more than 3 or 4 years, chances are you are not coming back. But a few riders returned to the Grand Tour after many years. One wonders what brought them back after so long a time. It would probably make an interesting story as to how some of these riders came back after 30 years and how the Grand Tour had changed for them in the interim. Below are listed those with more than a 17 year gap (the number of years they <u>didn't</u> ride between completions).

Grand Tour Grand Slam. We took this idea from tennis. Completing the "Grand Slam" would be completing the Century, Double, Triple and Quadruple in separate years. Ideally, you would do them in that order, but the century is so new, that's not likely. In fact, no one has completed the Grand Slam. 17 riders have done the Century, Double and Triple and would only need the Quad, but let's face it – that's not so easy to add. But amazingly, 22 riders have done the Quad, Triple and Double and only need the Century to complete the Grand Slam. They are listed below:
