


Both Rafi and Phil took a photo of this tree which I had never seen before. David (our resident plant expert) identified it as an African Tulip Tree.

This Sunday: This Sunday we will be doing our annual running of "Malibu Vistas." These routes all start in the Malibu Civic Center area and head north to Neptune's Net for lunch and then return. The short does this with only a few hills going out and back. The medium and the long add a climb up Latigo Canyon before lunch and then come back down to PCH on Mulholland Hwy. After lunch the medium heads directly back (the same route as the short) while the long adds a climb up Yerba Buena before coming down Encinal to join the other routes on the return. These are fairly tough routes and I'm pretty sure I will only be doing the medium and I could be talked into doing only the short. A portion of Westward Beach Road (near Zuma Beach) which is on all the routes, was washed out by waves last week. I'm not sure they have made repairs yet, so we may have to skip that portion and stay on PCH going up Zuma Hill.
