Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - October, 19, 2021

Hello All:

Sunday: On Sunday we were riding "Revel the Rollies - Corona" which stared in the city of Orange. We had 6 riders which isn't too bad for a somewhat remote start. I took this photo at the start:

I was behind the entire group, but when I got to Featherly Park I saw David who said Rafi had stopped for a bathroom break. I went on and soon came upon Mario bandaging Thomas's leg. From what I can tell, a rock had leapt out of nowhere to take Thomas down. While his knee was being attended to, I got a text from Rafi telling me that David had a flat. Thomas seemed good to go, so we started riding again. Rafi soon caught us and said David was back riding with Russ. Soon I was riding alone again, but kept expecting David to catch me. I got to lunch only a short time after the group, but discovered that Thomas was not feeling tip top after his crash and had cut off to do the medium. That left only Rafi and Mario at lunch and they weren't really planning on eating lunch (other that food they carried with them) I wanted lunch, so I told them to go on. I was still expecting David. After lunch I started back, having never seen David, but I had a pleasant ride back. There was some headwind, but it also kept me cool. I had forgotten how much the route uses newer streets out that way so that most of the route was on wide streets with a wide shoulder or bike lane. I remembered a large housing development on the return and I thought I would get some photos there, but I had forgotten that this was a walled development and I couldn't actually see any of the houses. Finally, only about 100 yards from the end of the ride I did come upon this display:
