Meanwhile, the short route took me directly to the Marina where everyone usually meets up for a break, but only Gary and David showed up. I guess everyone else had to get home. You can see that the weather was great. It was my first regular club ride since sometime in August, and it went very well for me.

Sunday: The Sunday ride was "Reseda Park - Phase I" There were only 4 of us at the start and I took this shot:

They opted to do the optional climb up Kagel Canyon and sent these photos. The first is from Julie and the second is from Dale




You can see Dale and Edwin near the bottom

This Week: On Sunday we will be riding "Revel the Rollies - Corona." All routes start from a park in the city of Orange and ride to Corona and back. That's just about all the short route does. The medium adds a loop in Corona while the long adds a run out to Tom's Farm" for lunch and back. All nice routes which don't have an excessive amount of climbing and which ride an area we don't get to very often. Although it's a long drive to do only a short ride, I plan to do the short route again because I don't think I'm ready for the medium yet. I hope to see some others there. **NOTE:** The start location is slightly different than in the past. It's in the same park, but a different parking lot in that park.

Patch of The Week: This patch comes from Nancy Domjanovich.



This is a fairly rare patch. I think the basic patch was provided by the National League of American Wheelmen to any club holding a "hilly ride." But we modified the patch by embroidering the "Ridge Route" on it to make it specific to a ride the club used to offer. This was a route going up the old Ridge Route from Castaic to near Gorman. The road has been closed to traffic for years but before Hwy 99 (later to become the I-5) was built, it was the only route up and over the Tejon Pass Once it was closed to traffic, it started deteriorating and by 1992 when Nancy did this ride, it was in pretty bad shape, although still passable by bicycles. Nancy says the elevation gain on the ride was 5230 feet. Although I didn't ride with Nancy that day, I did the Ridge Route a couple of times but now it has deteriorated to the point they don't even want bicycles up there. There is an organization that has been trying to restore it, but I don't think they have made much progress.
