**This Weekend:** We have two rides this weekend. First, on Saturday we have the "Rose Bowl Century." This is a novelty ride which we started some years ago, but we only ride it every two years. The challenge is simple enough -- ride laps around the Rose Bowl until you have ridden 100 miles. It takes about 33 laps to do that. It's more of a mental challenge than a physical one. Can you deal with the boredom of riding round and round and can you avoid the temptation at the end of every lap when you pass your car and want to just call it a day. Actually, I don't find it all that boring because you pass different joggers all day long. You don't have to ride 100 miles. I plan to shoot for only a metric century (62 miles). There is limited food available in the area but since I pass my car every 3 miles, I usually just bring my own lunch and snacks and stop for a break or lunch whenever I feel like it. More riders make it more fun so I hope to see

some of you out there.

On Sunday, our regular ride is once again "The Amazing Maze" which starts down in Tustin. Yes, this is the third time it has been scheduled this year, but it has been rained out the first two times. Fortunately, there is no talk of rain this weekend, so we should be good to go. All routes head to the Yorba Linda area for lunch and then on to the "maze" in Villa Park before returning to the start. The long takes a roundabout way to lunch with some additional climbing and a more hilly return after the maze. The short and medium take shorter routes to lunch, using the Santa Ana River Trail for much of the distance, and then an easier route back. I don't know how tired I'll be after riding 62 miles around the Rose Bowl on Saturday, but I hope to show up and do the medium route on Sunday. I'll certainly be slow, so why not join me for a slow and easy ride on Sunday.
