Saturday: On Saturday we were riding the biennial Rose Bowl Century where riders attempt to ride a century by completing as many laps around the Rose Bowl as necessary. One lap is 3.1 miles so it takes about 33 laps. There were five of us out on the course, but for once, I have no photos of the riders. Besides myself, there were **Phil Whitworth, Mario Solano, Edwin Dair** and **Jacques Stern.** I did take a photo of Phil's and my cars with the Rose Bowl in the background to show we were there.



I only planned on riding a metric century which took 21 laps and I finished in the early afternoon. Jacques told me he was planning on riding less than 100 miles as well, but I don't know how far he went. I believe the other three did a full century. I know Phil did because he posted the ride on Strava. I didn't see much of the other two except as they lapped me numerous times. Shortly before I finished, Mario passed me and said he was already over 80 miles so he was definitely on track to get in a century. This Week: On Sunday we will be riding "Looking for Leona" which is our monthly century and metric century for March. This year I have added a 50 mile course for those who don't want to do a century. The full century gets its extra miles by starting in the Valley and first riding out to Santa Clarita where the other two routes start, and also riding back to the Valley at the end of the ride. From Santa Clarita, all three routes ride up San Francisquito Canyon. The two centuries ride all the way to the end and then over to Leona Valley for lunch. They then ride Bouquet Canyon back down to Santa Clarita. The half century stops before the top of San Francisquito at Green Valley for lunch and then rides Spunky Canyon over to Bouquet Canyon to rejoin the other routes. The big climb of the day is of course San Francisquito which totals about 2000 feet of climbing. I hope to do the half century, but that climb is more than I have done in a long time, so I suppose I might turn around and coast back down before reaching the top. I could use some company to keep my spirits up.

Awards Lunch and Ride: Just a reminder that the annual Awards Lunch will be on Sunday, April 7th. Since I don't believe everyone reads these e-mails, I plan to send out a separate invitation tomorrow night complete with a map (since the new location is sort of hard to find).
