


The little dot to the lower right of the sun is Venus. There is another eclipse in two years visible in Iceland. Kit says he might try that one.

THE HISTORIC MANHATTAN BEACH PIER'S ICONIC "SEA FOAM" RAILINGS ARE GETTING A FACELIFT!

The Manhattan Beach Pier, originally built in 1920 and structurally reconstructed in 1991, is a significant historical landmark and the oldest concrete pier on the West Coast. The project involves replacing the Pier's perimeter handrails and reconstructing the staircases at the base to meet current building codes, address corrosion, and enhance durability. The Pier will remain open during construction.
